

Installation Precautions

- 1. Ensure a Level and Plumb Base:** The installation surface (wall and floor) must be perfectly level, plumb, and structurally sound. Any unevenness can prevent proper door operation and compromise safety.
- 2. Precise Measurement is Critical:** Always take final measurements after all tiles and the are fully installed. Measure width, height, and diagonals at multiple points to guarantee accuracy.
- 3. Use the Right Sealant:** Always use a high-quality, 100% silicone, mildew-resistant sealant for all sealing applications. Avoid harsh acids that can damage the hardware and glass edges.

Usage Precautions

- 1. Gently Open and Close:** Slide the door smoothly along the track or swing it gently. Avoid slamming it against the frame or wall to prevent glass damage or hardware loosening.
- 2. Mind the Gap:** Keep hands and body clear of the door edges during operation to prevent pinching. Supervise children closely.
- 3. Keep Tracks Clean:** Regularly clean the bottom track of sliding doors to remove hair, soap scum, and debris, ensuring smooth operation and preventing derailment.
- 4. No Heavy Objects:** Do not hang towels, robes, or other heavy items on the door handles or the top. Excess weight can strain and damage the hardware.
- 5. Ventilate After Use:** Open a window or turn on the exhaust fan after showering to reduce humidity, which helps prevent hardware corrosion and sealant degradation.
- 6. Clean with Care:** Use a soft cloth and a recommended glass cleaner. Avoid abrasive pads, or strong acidic/alkaline cleaners that can scratch the glass or corrode hardware.
- 7. Inspect Seals Periodically:** Check the waterproof seals around the frame regularly for signs of aging, cracking, or detachment. Replace them promptly if needed to prevent leaks.
- 8. Avoid Sharp Impacts:** Prevent direct contact with sharp objects (e.g., hooks, tools) on the glass surface during cleaning or use to avoid scratches or damage.
- 9. Address Unusual Noises:** If scraping, squeaking, or sticking occurs, immediately inspect the rollers, track, and hinges. Apply a suitable lubricant or contact customer support.

- 10. Check Hardware Regularly:** Periodically inspect all screws, hinges, and fittings for tightness. Tighten them if necessary to ensure the door remains secure.
